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# URIAH HEEP

O.K., so Uriah Heep have had more than their fair share of criticism, problems and line-up changes. But through all this, with a backbone of faith, determination and worldwide public support Uriah Heep have managed to maintain gold awards for their albums and in the present become one of the world's most successful touring bands. It has, however, taken them longer than most to find the ideal band personnel and a unity-in-musical-policy.

That time has arrived. "New Boys" John Lowrie Morris and Trevor Bolder (both have now been members for a year, which has proved to be the most important twelve months for Heep since their formation eight years ago) Heep have - as they knew they would - successfully ridden the departure of former front-man David Byron, and even more so, the charms of heavy metal; a tag which they had been burdened with, until recently.

The future now for Heep looks set to be bigger and better than ever before, and when one considers

their past achievements there's a very forthright statement. Here are the facts. Heep's last album "Fleely" was something of a landmark in their career. Although recording soon marked only a matter of days after the arrival of Lowrie and Bolder, the album displayed their influence and featured that subtle musical change which Heep originals, Ken Hensley, Mick Box and Lee Kerslake had already been seeking.

Heep plunged straight into the deep end by making their live debut with the new line-up in America last December. The States have always been Heep's biggest market and many a lesser band would have shied it safe and made their debut in some obscure far off land. The gamble paid off. Heep not only regained their status but found a whole new following in the process.

February of this year saw the British and European release of "Fleely", backed up by extensive tours of most territories involved. The most important fact to emerge from the British

tour was that critics, who only months previously had been happily forming their dooms, were now granting tremendous reviews and predicting great prospects for the band. The European spring tour proved to be just as successful. Heep were back on top in a big way. In Germany the release of one of Heep's earliest tracks "Lady In Black", saw it entering their national charts only two weeks after release.

Uriah Heep, so far this year, have also toured America again, played a massive European Festival tour and for the first time, toured Yugoslavia which proved to be a sell-out all the way.

Uriah Heep now release their 13th album, "Devil's Victim". All the potential that "Fleely" began to reveal is now realized on this album, never before have Heep sounded so good. After the autumn tour of Great Britain Heep will undertake winter tours of Europe and America followed in the New Year by Australia and Japan.

# Individual Biographies

Ken Hensley

One of the longest members of URAH HEAR, Ken Hensley is also the main songwriter in the band.

Ken started out as a guitarist playing local clubs around his home town of Stevenage, before graduating to Harrowden Organ at the age of 18.

He eventually settled in London where he joined the Quire with Mick Taylor, Lee Kerslake and Greg Lake, soon moving on to Ten Foot Tall by Cliff Bennett, before forming the nucleus of Uriah Heep with Mick in 1969.

Apart from his thirteen albums with Uriah, Ken has also recorded two solo albums, 'Proud Words On A Dusty Shelf' (1973) and 'Singer To Please' (1978). He is currently midway through recording his third solo album which will be released in early 1980.

## HISTORY OF URIAH HEEP

Heep originally evolved from a garage outfit known featuring David Byron, Mick Box and Paul Newton.

Upon Ken Hensley joining, they released debut album "Very 'Eavy Very 'Umble" followed by "Shanabury" and "Look At Yourself".

Following the recording "Demons and Wizards", former Gary Thain and drummer Lee Kerslake joined.

Line-up remained unchanged through next four albums, "Magician's Birthday", "Uriah Heep Live", "Sweet Freedom" and "Wanderer".

Following illness, Gary Thain left in Autumn '74 to be replaced by John Wetton who made his debut on "Return To Fantasy".

November '75, "Bliss of . . ." released.

During '76, "High and Mighty" released, shortly followed by the departure of David Byron and John Wetton.

Following long search through Germany, John Leeson joined along with Trevor Bolder during the Autumn of '78.

Heavy's greatest drummer has been with the band since the classic *Demons & Wizards* album.

Born in Barnsley, Lee underwent the usual apprenticeship of playing in numerous local bands before joining the band, along with Ken Hensley, in 1967. He then spent two years with Tom Paton prior to forming the Laser Head Band in 1970. In 1972 Lee met up with his old friend Ken Hensley and as a result joined Uriah Heep in November of that year. Touring the world alongside Lee plenty of variety for his favorite pastime, fishing.

Born in Walthamstow, London, Mick's introduction to guitars began at a very early age. He says in fact, that when he bought a small guitar with four strings from a music shop, it took him several days to discover that it was a guitar! Following this initial setback he bought his first real guitar from a pawnbrokers shop for £1.7. He did not begin to teach himself during his teens he played in local bands before forming The Stalkers with former Uriah Heep violinist David Byron. Mick and David then split to form a second band, Spine, who were signed by Grey Eagle at the Blue Club in High Wycombe. Harry put the band into a studio, Ken Hensley joined, and Uriah Heep was born.

Born in Hull, Trevor Bolder, along with John joined Heep in autumn '70.

His earliest recollections are of playing guitars at the age of eight on a Belmont Boys band. He continued to accompany guitar and played in various school bands before taking up bass at 10.

Trevor's first professional band was The Haze who also featured local talents, Mick Ronson and Wendy Woodmansey. All three then moved on with David Bowie to record the *Hunky Dory* album. Trevor stayed with Bowie for over two years playing on all of Bowie's classic albums, notably *Ziggy Stardust* and *Aladdin Sane*.

After a year's break following the split with Bowie, Trevor reformed the band from May and released one album before joining Heep.

Without doubt one of Uriah Heep's vocalists, John originated from Hull before moving to Newcastle in his teens, where he began singing in local clubs etc.



In September 1970 Uriah Heep heard a number of John's tapes and following a long search throughout Europe he was contacted and asked to join Heep.



# FURY

A chance meeting between two Canadians and two brothers from Ottawa led to the formation of Arista's newest wave-swinging FURY. Their interesting and diverse musical backgrounds immediately set them aside from the punk genre and into a more structured category of nearly square rock, refined, and yet raw, brimming with genuine energy.

First of all there's lead vocalist Jeff Molton and guitarist D. O'Neil. They arrived in Britain from Ottawa early in the year to sort out some musical frustrations that had built up on the Canadian music scene. Ottawa's hardly the place to be if you're after fortune or fame, and after playing in local bands they realised the hopelessness of the situation. "We'd be gigging until 2.00 a.m., and at 4.00 a.m. we would get pissed and complain about the bands we were in," explained D. "Eventually we came to England with little or no money, selling things in order to raise the money to come across. FURY is the first thing we started."

The other side of the story is similarly fascinating as Pete and Steve Barnes, on drums and bass respectively, also realised that their musical aspirations were unlikely to remain fulfilled so long as they remained in Ottawa. They took their first positive

step by being thrown out of grammar school there for fighting — move that was compounded by their dad Bill, a physics and maths teacher in the year.

The plan thinnings as we learn that not only was Bill in the same band as Pete and Steve, but another brother, Gary made up the numbers. The name of their band? You guessed it, Barnes!

The band's penchant was for jazz rock. "But the most we could do in Dover was local change work," the brothers explained. "We reached the limit of the Shanty Major blues/rock garage but got nowhere and so we broke up, rethinking and finding ourselves in the same frustrated situation as D. and Jeff". Having a musical dad ensured that they were exposed to music. "He's supported us all along, particularly when we were thrown out of school and he thought coming to London was a great idea prompting us don't waste time."

The groupies also played it's dues and, recalls Jeff, "we also heard about Pete and Steve by visiting to places like the Speckle Bay. Up until then we'd found it hard to find the right drummer but we hit it off right away."

A potential publisher that secured the band a room in one of the studios, and with remarkable speed, they secured a recording contract. It was an appearance at London's Marquee that

convinced Arista of FURY's talents.

The acquisition of the band name is another point worth recording, since it is a translation of one of their previous Canadian bands 'Michael Fury'. "Everyone got onto us to change it because it sounded like a solo artist — like Fury's brother or something but now we actually prefer FURY," says friend Jeff. "It says much more about the band."

The band went into the studio with producer James Guthrie and from these sessions emerged several fine tracks, including "Misunderstanding", their first single, which will also be the title track of the forthcoming album. The album represents a clever blend of hard rock and melody and arranged tracks. "We didn't want to sound over produced — there was a temptation to do a lot of overdubs but we wanted to get a 'live feel', explains Jeff. "James, who also produces The Moves and engineers for Heartbeat was great to work with."

FURY have just finished touring with Dire Straits and took with them all the confidence of a band accustomed to headlining. "Why not? We've got enough faith in our music," says Pete, "we all know that what we're playing now is the best we've done."

And with a gutsy album under their belt, a lot of people will be coming in contact with the sound of FURY.



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
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
